 Love is a command, not a feeling! (John 13:34, John 15:9-13, Mark 12:30-31) Love is the ability to overcome offences by grace. Love is also the elimination of barriers, allowing oneself to be light and salt regardless of the circumstance, objections, and opinions of others. Love is not a feeling because if it were based on our feelings the difficulty of loving our enemy and blessing those who curse us, confirms that love could never win. 




 Love is unconditional! in His presence.






Love heals! (Matthew 8:3, Mark 5:25-33) heal.

When love touches the broken it repairs when love acknowledges the hidden it builds confidence, when love lances out to the deep, it walks

















